

Lesson Plan Guidelines Visual Arts

- All instructors are required to submit a lesson plan. **Lesson plans are due Monday April 8th.**
- It's better to over plan! Be sure to have enough projects to fill time and to keep campers engaged and excited about art!
- All art projects for Visual Arts need to relate to the session description for the week.

Lesson Plan Cover Page:

- Include Week #, Dates of Session, Session Theme, and Teacher Name.
- Main Lessons: Create 3 to 4 Main Lessons to facilitate each day.
- Quick Lesson: This is your go to project that's less involved and can fill time.
- Self-Directed Lesson: This is a project that campers can work on independently throughout the week. When campers finish their Main Lessons early, direct them to work on this project.
 - Example: Sketchbook Drawing: direct campers to draw something relating to the camp session description in their sketch books.

Lesson Plans:

For each project, please be sure to include the following:

- Project Title: Name the project to be facilitated and include a photo of the project to be completed.
- Project Steps: Include the necessary steps needed to complete the project. Please be clear and concise with your step by step instructions.
- Regular Supplies: Refer to the Visual Arts Cart Inventory Sheet for a list of "Regular Supplies" to be used for projects.
- Extra Supplies: Refer to the Extra Supplies Available list for all "Extra Supplies" to be used in projects.

Please refer to the sample lesson plan included for further explanation.

Visual Arts Projects CAN Include Some of the Following:

- **Clay Project**: Using air dry clay, campers will sculpt an object relating to the camp topic.
Supplies: air dry clay, tempera paint, paint brushes, paint trays, mod podge, and clay tools
- **Collage Project**: Campers will create a colorful image relating to the camp topic.
Supplies: construction paper, tissue paper, newspaper or magazines, scissors, glue, black sharpies
- **Drawing Project**: Campers will draw people, places and/or things relating to the camp topic.
Supplies: pencils, colored pencils, oil pastels, colored markers, black sharpies, crayons, black construction paper, drawing paper
- **Painting Project**: Campers will paint people, places and/or things relating to the camp topic.
Supplies: brushes, paint trays, watercolor paint, or tempera paint
- **Printmaking Project**: Campers will choose a person, place or thing relating to the camp topic. Using a pencil, campers will create a simple line drawing on scratch foam.
Supplies: pencils, scratch foam, brayers, ink, foam trays, and construction paper.
- **Sculpture Project**: Campers will create a 3D non clay sculpture relating to the camp topic.
Supplies: newspaper, paper mache paste, balloons, soup cans, egg crates, toilet paper rolls, paper bowls, bucket.

SUPPLIES:

- All Visual Arts camp instructors shall use the supplies listed on the “Visual Arts Cart Inventory” AND the “Extra Camp Supplies” forms for their art projects throughout the week.
- **No budget is available for ordering any specialty supplies not listed or included on the supply lists provided.**
- When listing the supplies needed for each project, please be specific and clear about what you need. Include the amount, size, and color of your supplies.
 - **EXAMPLES:** Yarn: red, 12 inches per camper
Fabric: Purple, cotton, 1 yard per camper
Styrofoam Balls: 15 at 2 inches
Watercolor Paper: 15 pieces cut to 5x7
Tissue Paper: 5 sheets each of red, green, and yellow
Construction Paper: 15 sheets of orange
Printmaking Ink: Purple, Red, and Turquoise

Visual Arts Camp (Ages 7-10)

Exciting hands-on art projects allow campers to explore art, meet creative challenges, and develop fundamental art skills. Campers will broaden their creativity through drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, and many other artistic mediums. Finish the week with an art show on Friday at 2:30pm to share your awesome artwork!

Week 1: *5/28-5/31 (4 days)

Creative Explorations

Join this journey of creativity and discovery! Campers will explore a variety of art concepts that incorporate both traditional and innovative materials and techniques. Discover the joy of creative expression thru drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and more.

Week 2: 6/3-6/7

Masters of Art

Learn about the exciting art styles and techniques of the great masters of art including Monet, Picasso, and Van Gogh. Campers will explore a variety of art elements as they draw, paint, sculpt, and more. Experiment with recreating the masters as you create your own style.

Week 3: 6/10-6/14

Art Around the World

Get ready to discover art from around the globe! Campers will create art souvenirs and document their travels as they create multicultural works of art. World art projects will incorporate various art materials, explore different cultures, and encourage creativity.

Week 4: 6/17-6/21

Summer Studio

Discover fun and exciting methods to express your inner creativity! Campers will experiment with an assortment of art materials and mediums to create an exciting collection of unique masterpieces. Art projects will include clay, collage, drawing, painting, sculpture, and more.

Week 5: 6/24-6/28

Painting Possibilities

Experience the colorful wonderful world of paint. Campers will explore their artistic abilities, try different painting techniques, and discover new skills. Learn about color mixing, blending, application, and more.

Week 6: *7/1-7/5 (4 days-no camp on 7/4)

Street Art

Explore the world of graffiti art. Learn color techniques such as blending, balance, and shading while working with different mediums. Campers will experiment with chalk pastels, paint, stencils, vinyl, and markers to create their own stylized works of art. Finish the week creating a group mural for all to enjoy.

Week 7: 7/8-7/12

Absolutely Abstract

Explore the world of abstract art through color, line, shape, and composition. Learn about the masters of abstract expressionism such as Jackson Pollock and Piet Mondrain. Campers will create abstract masterpieces using charcoal, paint, fiber, and more.

Week 8: 7/15-7/19

Art in Nature

Learn about the colors and shapes found in nature. Campers will create nature themed works of art as they collage, draw, paint, weave, and sculpt. Come celebrate nature and create your very own nature inspired masterpieces!

Week 9: 7/22-7/26**Cartoons, Comics, & Creatures**

Bring your favorite cartoon characters to life! Campers will learn how to draw emotion, action, and background scenes as they create personalized creatures, comics, and cartoons. Enjoy a fun filled week of design and drawing as you develop anime, self-portraits, storyboards, and more.

Week 10: 7/29-8/2**Mixed Media Mash-Up**

Discover the secrets of creating dimension, texture, and depth by combining elements of drawing, painting, collage, and printmaking. Experiment with paint, ink, stamps, stencils, paper and more. Campers will learn new methods and techniques for creating unique mixed media art projects.
