



We will explore surface decorations such as sgraffito, underglaze transfers, slip trailing and silkscreening. The class is project based and beginning students are encouraged to create the projects to learn basic techniques. Intermediate and advanced students are welcome to bring in their own ideas and work independently, or join in making the class project. All students will be assisted as needed during the class period. A basic handbuilding tool kit will be available to purchase for a \$15 fee paid to the instructor through Venmo or cash on the first day of class.

CREATIVE DRAWING: EXPLORE THE WONDERS OF MIXED MEDIA (GRAPHITE, CHARCOAL, INK & MORE...)

According to Noah Webster, Drawing, essentially a technique where an instrument is used to mark paper or another two-dimensional surface in which images are depicted on a surface by making lines, tonal areas, washes and other non-linear marks. Instruments used might be pencils, NeoColor Crayons, pens with inks, brushes with paints, or any combination.

Through the projects we will work on in class, we'll examine the unique benefits each tool provides to better understand its use in both solo works and in concert with any of the myriad of others available --- And the fun part is all the while students develop the skills they will need & use through their artistic career.

Drawing is a visual art that uses an instrument to mark paper or another two-dimensional surface. The instruments varied & over time we will learn much about each of them and the magic they bring to otherwise unadorned surfaces.
